

## Community Nursing Research Strategy for Wales - Board TERMS OF REFERENCE

Introduction	In order to obtain the best patient outcomes in community nursing, practice needs to be underpinned by robust research-based evidence. A Community Nursing Research Strategy has been developed and implemented in Wales to provide the nursing profession with the evidence to support future organisational and professional change in achieving excellence in the community. This was developed in partnership with education, research, health services, workforce planning and Government.
