# 3. Update

The WSPCR was requested to organise a **research masterclass** for the Directors of Nursing from all the Welsh Health Boards on Friday 11th September. It was funded by the Health Minister and attended by the CNO. It also included the Head of the NISCHR and the manager of AHSC. The masterclass included the presentation of the Welsh Community Nurse Research Strategy which aims to raise the quality and quantity of research in Community Nursing in Wales. The workshop also generated further areas for research activity/priority. An action plan is currently being drafted to take this forward, and will be shared at a meeting, to be held 25<sup>th</sup> October.

The team have been asked to hold another masterclass for the allied health executives for Wales (date tbc).

Cwm Taff HB are developing a questionnaire to be sent out to all staff to gauge past experience and future interest in research. ABMU may also follow this.

#### b. Pilot Money

2 community nursing pilot study applications have been awarded from WSPCR flexible funding scheme:

'Developing Quality Care Metrics for Community Specialist Nurses in Rural Wales'. Deborah Roberts.

'North Wales Pressure Ulcer Prevention and Intervention Service (PUPIS): Pilot study to explore the feasibility and acceptability of Tele-PUPIS in the Community Setting.' Fiona Irvine.

There are still funds available and CW is working with C&V to submit a pilot application for point of care testing for INR.

### c. Strategy Support

£70K WSPCR funding has also secured for Carolyn Wallace to provide strategic support as academic nurse community lead for the Community Nursing Research Strategy (2 days/week). Possible option to request match funding from the General Nursing Council Trust.

Angela Watkins is also providing some admin / communications / event support. The WSPCR also has expertise to support grant application writing / costing. Other ideas for developing strategy support are welcome.

e. **Information packs** needed for the disseminating information about the group to organisations and individuals through events such as the CNO and public health conference.

Update: CNRS branded folders have been printed and Carolyn Wallace is currently working on finalising the content for the packs.

### f. 1<sup>st</sup> Conference

Noted: Sue Thomas has already held a CNR conference in 2011. It would be possible to partner up with RCN, RCM, Healthcare Forum and Practice Nurse Association to help encourage participation.

Barriers to attending – some staff may have to take a day's leave to attend. It would be good to hold the conference Autumn 2014 to reflect on progress one year in. Poster presentations would be useful in attracting participation from students, as well as generating ideas.

**Action:** Sue Thomas to look into possible dates for the conference, which will not clash with other HB or national conference events.

**Action:** It would also be useful to have a presence at the CNO's Day (22 May 2014). Ruth Davies to see if this is possible.

Mapping exercise (to include school nurses)

- PhDs Possible to engage with HEIs to suggest ideas for evaluation research for PhD students e.g. maths students. A project brief would be required outlining research question, research gap, methodology, access to clinical staff/data. Such research would add to the evidence base and strengthen potential future bids.
  The potential pitfalls regarding newly qualified 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> year nurses taking on a PhD e.g. skills gained are not always valued clinically.
  Clinical academic career pathways need to be considered e.g. incorporating joint appraisals. JK is currently in discussion regarding this, it would be useful to address in a meeting with the CNO.

**Action:** PhD student case studies such as Nick West and Jackie Austen would be useful in highlighting the principles which work well / what we can learn from e.g. employer engagement to re-integrate the student upon completion of their PhD (CW/AW).

**Action:** JK to lead framework development work for key areas of potential PhD research topics.

• Board membership – it would be good to have a consultant nurse on the Board.
